The City of Portland is a Municipal corporation incorporated within the State of Oregon.

6. Briefly describe the activity or project for which funding is requested (please keep to 500 words or less.)

The project would construct a 12-foot sidewalk on one side of SE 122nd Ave between SE Raymond and the Springwater Trail. It would also construct curb ramps at intersections for improved bicycle access, plant street trees, which would provide environmental benefits and beautify the area, and provide

“green” stormwater treatment, which will reduce the influx of surface water into the sewer system and reduce groundwater contamination.

9. What is the purpose of the project? Why is it a valuable use of taxpayer funds? How will the project support efforts to improve the economy and create jobs in Oregon?

The City of Portland is working to improve infrastructure in outer Southeastern Portland to accommodate increased population density in the area. SE 122nd Ave has been identified in the East Portland Action Plan as a key collector street in need of improved pedestrian access and safety.

This project would provide critical infrastructure improvements in a rapidly growing area of Portland. These improvements will greatly increase and improve access to this area for consumers, pedestrians, and bicyclists, which will provide a significant economic benefit to the region.

This project will also provide a significant environmental benefit through the planting of street trees, which will help counteract the emission of carbon dioxide. Additionally, it will include green infrastructure components that will extend the life of the stormwater system by more efficiently managing the flow of surface stormwater, and treat surface stormwater to prevent the contamination of groundwater.

This project would create approximately 40 new jobs for its duration.
